#### Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The charity's objects are to work towards eliminating discrimination and to promote equality of opportunity and good relations between all persons in the Borough of Charnwood, in the County of Leicestershire. The charity is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 19 August 2008.

New trustees are introduced to the workings of the charity. During the past year all the trustees were able to attend a day's dedicated training on the production of an improved business plan. Trustees are encouraged to identify training needs and attend appropriate external courses.

The board of trustees, which has up to 16 members, administers the charity and meets monthly. There are sub-committees responsible for membership, personnel, finance and property, marketing and publicity, and youth.

Partnership is key to the charity's method of working. Financial support is given by Leicestershire County Council, Charnwood Borough Council, Lloyds TSB Foundation for England and Wales, Equality and Human Rights Commission and the British Council to carry out work programmes for them.

The charity also works in partnership with statutory bodies, the Bangladeshi Ekota Project, Loughborough Council of Faiths, Charnwood Refugee and Asylum Seekers Forum, Leicestershire Learning Disability Partnership, Chamber of Commerce, Racial Harassment Contact Group, East Midlands Racial Equality Consortium and the Minorities of Europe.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

### TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

A key element in the management of financial risk is the setting of a reserves policy and its regular review by trustees. Trustees have resolved to ensure that the charity is able to continue to provide all services for a period of at least two months in the event of a significant proportion of our income not being realised and also, in the event of having to come to a close, sufficient funds to meet all its obligations.

In order to meet these obligations, the trustees have set a minimum level of £40,000 for the charity's free reserves.

#### Objectives and activities

To work towards eliminating discrimination and to promote equality of opportunity and good relations between all persons in the Borough of Charnwood, in the County of Leicestershire.

#### Achievements and performance

Ensuring our work delivers our aims

This report for the year ended 31 March 2010 is the first full year we have expanded our public benefit work across all equality groups. We have endeavoured to reflect the diversity of these strands in our membership and relationships with people and organisations across the Borough of Charnwood

Our first achievement was working in close partnership with Charnwood Borough Council and Leicestershire Police to establish a Hate Incident Action Project, funded by the Equality and Human Rights Commission.

This enables hate incidents across all the equality strands to be reported at centres across the borough with follow up monitoring and support given to victims.

A second achievement has been setting up the South Asian Womens' Project, funded by Lloyds TSB Foundation for England and Wales. This enables and encourages women with a south asian background to play a more active role in society..

During the year we continue to provides the following services:

Welfare Benefits & Immigration/Nationality Work

We advise and take up individual casework and liaise with the Home Office and other agencies. Assistance is given in completing necessary forms on various issues, for example housing, education, welfare benefits, immigration and nationality on behalf of service users.

The Learning Disability Project

This is a full time link worker for black and minority ethnic people with learning disability to help choose the right health and social care services.

Youth Task Group

The group works in partnership with Minorities of Europe to organise conferences around "Mainstreaming Intercultural Learning in Youth Work". This brings together 25 young people from across Europe to Charnwood and is funded by the British Council.

There is a website for HR&EC which has been highly commended. It includes material from our trustees and links to other relevant sites. www.humanrightsandequalitiescharnwood.org

#### **Financial review**

The charity has total unrestricted funds carried forward of £61,651 (2009: £69,406) a decrease of £7,755.

#### NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### 1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

#### 1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Grants receivable are credited to the SOFA in the year to which they relate.

To ensure compliance with the accruals concept it may be necessary to defer income into the following period.

#### 1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

#### 1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £500 are capitalised and included at cost including any incidental expenses on acquisition.

Depreciation is provided using the following rates and bases to reduce by annual instalments the cost, less estimated residual value, of the tangible assets over their estimated useful lives:-

Fixtures and fittings 15% Reducing balance
Office Equipment 25% Reducing balance

No depreciation is provided on the charity's property as it is the organisation's policy to maintain this so as to extend it's useful life.

#### 1.5 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in futherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Investment income and gains are allocated to the specific fund.

#### 1.6 Value Added Tax

The Charity is not required to register for VAT. All income and expenses include VAT where applicable.

BCU Funding is provided by the Leicestershire Constabulary to assist in the prevention of anti-social behavour and crime.

The Learning Disability Partnership is funding given to employ and provide line management support to 1 full time equivalent Link Worker to support families from Black and Minority Ethnic Communities to access learning disability services.

Awards for All is funding given for the design and initial set up of a data base and maintenance for system support for caseworkers.

Leicestershire Council for Voluntary Youth Service is for repairs to the charity's property.

The Youth Task Group works in partnership with Minorities of Europe to organise conferences around "Mainstreaming Intercultural Learning in Youth Work". This brings together 25 young people from across Europe to Charnwood and is funded by the British Council.

The charity have successfully secured funding from Lloyds TSB Foundation for a two year project working with South Asian Women. The project helps women, particularly from the Bangladeshi community to play a fuller role in their environment and take a more active role in society.

In 2009 Human Rights and Equalities Charnwood in partnership with Charnwood Borough Council and Loughborough Police applied to Equality & Human Rights Commission for a 3 year project working around hate crime. A grant of £209,100 was successfully awarded in November and since then the initial preparations for the Hate Incident Project have been underway.
