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TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2015.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the overning document, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The charity's objects are to work towards eliminating discrimination and to promote equality of opportunity and good relations between all persons in the Borough of Charnwood, in the County of Leicestershire. The charity is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 19 August 2008.

The board strives to recruit members able to offer skills appropriate to a Company Limited by Guarantee. New trustees are introduced to the workings of the charity. During the past year the trustees were able to dedicate time on two separate occasions to consider the organisation's future direction, in light of the reduced income. These concentrated on ensuring the delivery of casework, albeit on a reduced scale, and new ways of securing funding including social enterprise. Trustees are encouraged to identify training needs and attend appropriate external courses.

The board of trustees, which has up to 12 members, administers the charity and meets monthly. There are sub-committees responsible for membership, personnel, finance and property, marketing and publicity, and youth.

The charity also has 3 co-option members during the year, these are AAkram and YAli.

Partnership is key to the charity's method of working. Financial support is given by Charnwood Borough Council, The Big Lottery Fund, Lloyds Foundation for England & Wales, The Henry Smith Trust, European Social Fund, the British Council and The Helen Jean Cope Charity to carry out work programmes for them.

The charity also works in partnership with statutory, voluntary agencies and community groups, Loughborough Council of Faiths, Charnwood Refugee and Asylum Seekers Forum, Hate Incident Action Group, The Race Equality Centre (Leicester), Leicester LGB&T Centre and the Minorities of Europe.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

A key element in the management of financial risk is the setting of a reserves policy and its regular review by trustees. Trustees have resolved to ensure that the charity is able to continue to provide all services for a period of at least two months in the event of a significant proportion of our income not being realised and also, in the event of having to come to a close, sufficient funds to meet all its obligations.

In order to meet these obligations, the trustees have set a minimum level of £10,000 for the charity's free reserves.

Objectives and activities

To work towards eliminating discrimination and to promote equality of opportunity and good relations between all persons in the Borough of Charnwood, in the County of Leicestershire.

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

Achievements and performance

To monitor and improve its performance, the trustees have adopted Practical Quality Assurance System for Small Organisations (PQASSO). Under this we review all aspects of policy and procedures, making improvements where necessary.

Since widening our activities across all the equality strands, we endeavour to reflect this diversity in our membership, relationships with people and organisations across the Borough of Charnwood.

During the year we continued to provide the following services:

Welfare Benefits & Immigration/Nationality Work on a limited basis provided by volunteers.

We advise and take up individual casework and liaise with the Home Office and other agencies. Assistance is given in completing necessary forms on various issues, for example housing, education, welfare benefits, immigration and nationality on behalf of service users.

Debt and money management

We delivered a 4 month debt and money management project for Charnwood Borough Council.

Stepping into work

We delivered a 6 month project for the European Social Fund to give training to 14 unemployed people.

Youth Task Group

The group works in partnership with Minorities of Europe to organise conferences around "Mainstreaming intercultural Learning in Youth Work".

We have a website which includes material from our trustees and links to other relevant sites www.hrec.org.uk. We continue to improve our site are on Twitter and Facebook.

Financial review

The charity has total unrestricted funds carried forward of £30,652 (2014: £55,535) a decrease of £24,883.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

Plans for the future

Following the delivery of a six-month European Social Fund project to train 14 unemployed people, the trustees are aware that there is a need to extend this work. The European Social Innovation Fund is delivering a programme for this and trustees are seeking to become a delivery partner.

A Big Lottery Fund bid to empower local BME men is in its second/final stage of submission.

Charnwood Borough Council have awarded a short term programme of debt and money management.

Trustees are working to increase fundraising and deliver training services.

Disclosure of information to auditors

Each of the trustees has confirmed that there is no information of which they are aware which is relevant to the audit, but of which the auditor is unaware. They have further confirmed that they have taken appropriate steps to identify such relevant information and to establish that the auditors are aware of such information.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The going concern basis is dependent on the charity continuing to receive grant funding. The funding received from Charnwood Borough Council is secure until March 2016 and the Awards for All funding is committed for a further 2 years. Also, in response to new challenges being faced by the charity's client base the trustees are talking to new and existing funders. The trustees are confident that the grant funding will continue on a basis that will provide the charity with sufficient resources for the foreseeable future. It is on this basis that the trustees consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis and the financial statements do not include any adjustments that may result should this grant funding not continue.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is fegally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Grants receivable are credited to the SOFA in the year to which they relate.

To ensure compliance with the accruals concept it may be necessary to defer income into the following period.

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £500 are capitalised and included at cost including any incidental expenses on acquisition.

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided using the following rates and bases to reduce by annual instalments the cost, less estimated residual value, of the tangible assets over their estimated useful lives:-

Fixtures and fittings

15% Reducing balance 25% Reducing balance

Office Equipment

No depreciation is provided on the charity's property as it is the organisation's policy to maintain this so as to extend it's useful life.

1.5 Foreign currency translation

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction.

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are included in net outgoing resources.

1.6 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in futherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Investment income and gains are allocated to the specific fund.

1.7 Value Added Tax

The Charity is not required to register for VAT. All income and expenses include VAT where applicable.

ESF Enable was funding from Skills Funding Agency for assisting people into work.
